Funding

There has been much coverage in the media about funding for non-government schools. Our funding comes from 3 sources, roughly broken into: The Commonwealth Government 50%; State Government 25%; and School Fees and Levies 25%.

Much of the commentary is misleading. The amount of money the Commonwealth gives to non-government schools is compared to what it gives to State schools. Often it is ignored that State governments are responsible for 100% funding of their schools paid out of GST money, and the Commonwealth is responsible for non-government schools. The states argue for additional funds to boost the money they pay towards running the schools they own. As payers of the GST and other taxes, you contribute to the funding of State schools. As payers of school fees, you actually save the state government the cost of fully paying for the education of your children!

The argument that Catholic Education Melbourne (CEM) has had with the Commonwealth has been about how the amount of money it gives is decided. Currently, the 5-year census data is used to determine how rich or poor the location of a school is, giving a socioeconomic (SES) level. In wealthier areas, parents are expected to pay more and receive less government money. CEM argued that the location was not an accurate reflection of the ability of our parents to pay. The Commonwealth said it was. CEM campaigned until the Commonwealth agreed to an independent review. This decided that the CEM was correct and the Commonwealth was wrong. Therefore, the Commonwealth is now going to increase money for Catholic and some other non-government schools. The generally more wealthy Independent Schools will most likely see their funding reduced. There is a letter attached from CEM.

Dear parents and carers

I write to you with great news about a recent funding commitment for our schools.

The Premier of Victoria, Daniel Andrews, and the Deputy Premier and Minister for Education, James Merlino have announced the ALP's commitment to provide \$400 million in funding over the next four years to upgrade and build new Catholic and other non-government schools.

Catholic education will be the big winners from the fund, with the Premier indicating that our schools will receive 70-80% of the new funding.

The Andrews Labor Government has also announced a range of planning reforms which will streamline existing processes to help us build and maintain facilities for Catholic school communities across the state.

On top of this, Mr Andrews has committed funding to support the removal of asbestos and the other hazardous materials, which will ensure that all of our schools, wherever they are, are safe.

This is a huge announcement for the Catholic sector, and is the largest capital funding commitment a Victorian Government has made to our schools.

I know the significant contribution you already make to maintaining and upgrading the facilities at your child's school, and I also know that you keep putting your hands in your own pockets to make sure that they can have the best places to learn in. Across Victoria, parents and carers are contributing 80 cents in every dollar that our school sector spends on capital works in our schools.

Today's announcement is an acknowledgement of that fact.

Today's announcement is also a welcome recognition of the hard work from you and other members of your school community have put in over the last 18 months, sending a very clear message to decision-makers: Catholic education matters.

If you have the opportunity, I encourage you to write and thank the Premier and the Deputy Premier and Minister for Education for their support of your school. Their addresses are:

Sweet Potato and Bacon Slice
